HABITS

Can we be open to reflection and change for renewal's sake?

I thrive on change! When bored with a part of my life, I rearrange furniture to enjoy "new scenery." Some time ago, I rearranged the living room furniture. Using my loveseat as room divider, I moved it to the center of the floor. It looked lovely! But when the lights went out, I forgot it was there. In the wee hours of the night, when I wandered in the dark, "Crash!" Several bumped knees later, I remembered it was there.

Much of what we do in life is habit: We do things without our minds being in gear; this includes more than walking around the house.

Of course, doing things habitually makes life easier. Imagine how exhausted we'd be if we had to think carefully about every little thing we do! But, herein lies danger, as well. What habits do we throw into the category of things we don't need to think about?

During Lent, we have periods of silence both in our Sunday morning and Wednesday evening worship. Our liturgies call for "silence and self-examination." We find these short periods of confession to be helpful to be sure, but sometimes more symbolic than effective. Can 60 or so seconds do all they're called to do? In 60 seconds, we are to call to mind our sins, so that we can know that God has forgiven them. We find 60 seconds a bit short to reflect on a week or two of heavy living. All we can manage is to quickly remember something that has been bothering us. But, do we really get down into the things we don't think about? Our habits?



It's not easy to let God into our collection of habits. It's not easy to let something be questioned that we have been doing without thinking. I pray during this season of Lent, these 60-second periods are not only short periods of reflection and confession, but reminders of the daily discipline required of us to reflect, repent and seek renewal.

One of our Christian "habits" is to pray the Lord's prayer. In Lent, we are especially called to focus on "Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us." If we believe God forgives our sins and heals the wounds they leave, then to take the time during Lent to let God dig deeper is to experience God's love and grace more deeply.

I leave you with a segment from a 1989 newspaper, a letter by two little children whose father was killed in a attempted robbery:

"Dear Mr. Garner, we wish you wouldn't have shot our Daddy; it makes us sad and mad. We miss our dad a lot!Sometimes the pain is so bad we can hardly stand it, and we cry a lot. You had no right to shoot our Daddy; it was very wrong. We are only 6 and 7 years old, but at least we know that he loved us.

We hope you can stop doing drugs and selling drugs, because you still have that chance. We also hope that you have learned that crime doesn't pay. The only thing we are happy about is that Daddy doesn't have to suffer with these drugs anymore.

We want you to know that we did forgive you for what you did on the day it happened. Please remember we don't hate you; so you don't let this ruin the rest of your life.

May the patterns of our lives – and our Lenten journey – be marked by such love and grace.
