The Music of Worship

We come together each week to worship together, and music is an integral part of our Lutheran worship services.

The worship service begins with the PRELUDE. This music is selected each week as a time to establish the mood or theme of the service. It is a time to sit and quiet your thoughts and prepare for worship. While the anticipation of worship and greeting friends is important, the service begins with the prelude as it acts as a buffer between the busy "secular time" of life and the focused "sacred time" of corporate worship. It aids in shifting focus from distractions to reverence. Once the prelude has begun, it is time to listen and prepare yourself for worship.

The word, liturgy, means the "work of the people" and is the structure used to tie the worship service together.

Musical settings change by season or approximately every four weeks. While the music varies, the format remains the same for all services.



Hymns are selected from various sources and hymnals to enhance the season, and, most importantly, the lessons of the day. Hymns and special music are used to pull all of the themes together.

Worshipping through music transforms us. Singing allows our hearts to speak to God in a way that doesn't happen as we hear the spoken word. It inclines our hearts to God in ways other forms can't accomplish.

Music that honors God will cause our hearts to sing; and when our hearts sing, worship happens.
