# From Generation to Generation...

For the seasons of Advent and Christmas this year, we will step back from the Revised Common Lectionary and instead use materials from A Sanctified Art. These materials will recall the storyline of events leading up to and after the birth of Jesus. We will hear new scriptures as well as old familiar ones around the birth of Jesus, honing in on all those involved in the story.

This Advent, we are invited to look at the characters in our scriptures and wonder: What did each character pass on or contribute? How did each character participate in God's liberation and love? Which characters try to thwart God's justice and what can we learn from them?

The work of God is always unfolding—in and through us. The theme of "From Generation to Generation..." is also a call to action. What are we being called to bring forth? What is

our generation's task in the good news that transcends time and space?
