Happy New Year: Advent Comes Again!

One of the blessings of the church calendar is that is keeps coming around and around: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Ordinary Time . . . and Advent once again!

Advent, the beginning of a new church, is an opportunity to begin new spiritual practices. This year, I'm taking my spiritual advice from Elizabeth Manneh, who suggests that we mark this season with attention and patience:

Read to feed your soul. This year, I will set aside my usual daily reading to savor these books: "A Surprising God: Devotions for an Uncertain Time," by Thomas Long and Donyelle McCray; "Advent in Plain Sight" by Jill Duffield; and "Waiting in Joyful Hope" by Catherine Upchurch.

Pray daily. This year, our PATHWAYS Center for Spiritual Renewal will make "Heaven and Nature Sing: Devotions for Advent and Christmas" available for each of us free of charge. Linvite you to join me in the daily discipline of praying through the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

Reach out to others. Advent reminds us of the coming of Christ in three different spheres: at his incarnation in Bethlehem; as he comes to us daily through our neighbor; as he returns at the end of time. This year, I will especially focus on Christ's daily coming through my neighbor. I will ask, "What is Christ, my neighbor, calling me to do in this time?"

Plan and wait with intention. The endless tasks on our holiday to-do list can end up consuming our time and attention, making it all but impossible to focus on our spiritual life. With a little intention, we can learn to focus on God as we do these necessary tasks: pray for the recipients of each gift we wrap; contemplate something we've read as we stir the cookie batter; or, make a mental list of the things we're grateful for while standing in a long line.

I wish each of you a Happy New Year and an intentional Advent.
