

January 6 is the feast of Epiphany and marks the end of the Christmas season. It is the day in the church year when we celebrate the revelation of God's glory in the person of Jesus Christ. We also remember the Magi's visit to Jesus and his family. I love celebrating Epiphany for several reasons.

On Epiphany, we are reminded that the magi followed the Star of Bethlehem's great light to find Jesus. The light shone in the darkness of the night, leading the way to the child that would be called the light of the world. During the season following Epiphany, we hear stories of the beginning of Jesus' ministry.

As the light of the world, Jesus shone light onto places of darkness – places where those who were outcast and marginalized struggled, and where those who had physical and mental infirmities begged for healing and acceptance. Jesus came for the world to turn upside down – for the hungry to be fed, the blind to see, the lame to walk, and for those without power to become powerful while those with power would lose theirs. The light of Christ which resides in each of us through the waters of baptism reveals who we are: the claimed and washed children of God. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ and to share the good news of God's love to all people.

Tax Tip from your Treasurer If you're taking



Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from your IRA, those dollars are typically taxed as ordinary income. The good news: If you're over $70\frac{1}{2}$, you can direct all or part of your RMD, up to \$100,000, to a qualified charity like CLC - and it will be excluded from your income. No need to itemize! This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution, or QCD, and can make a difference on your tax bill. Note: Custodians do not identify QCDs on Form 1099-R, so tell your tax preparer. Consult your financial advisor to determine which tax strategies are best for you.

Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS)

During the months of January and February, the Service and Outreach team will collect monetary donations for the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS). LIRS has been helping to welcome the most vulnerable to the United States since 1939, when it helped to resettle 30,263 displaced persons from Germany and Eastern Europe. They continue to respond to the needs of migrants, refugees, and asylum seekers in many ways with the help of more than 6,000 volunteers nationwide and more than 100 local affiliates. They offer refugee resettlement programs, foster care for refugee and migrant children who arrive unaccompanied, family reunification programs, leadership and economic empowerment programs for new Americans, and programs that help support individuals both during and after immigration detention.

Results HOPE FOR THE HOLIDAYS

Thank you for your generosity this holiday season! We were able to have some big impacts with local organizations; here are some of the totals from this year's donation drive:

- Pies for Rockford Rescue Mission: \$611.31 raised + \$250 Thrivent Action Grant purchased 65 pies


